A kitchen remodeling time frame includes lot of others activities such as design, permits, plumbing, electrical work, tiling, flooring, and more. Remodeling a kitchen often takes at a minimum several weeks to several months.

Remodeling is quicker than renovating

Wrong. Remodeling projects take longer than renovations because they often involve altering the space, such as adding or removing walls and structural changes.

Remodeling projects always stay on schedule.

Nope. Unexpected issues, such as structural problems, frequently arise during remodeling projects and can impact the delivery timeline. Changes in the scope of work, material shortages, and workforce availability also contribute to extending the project's timeframe.

Hiring more workers will speed up the process

Coordination between trades takes time, and more workers doesn't always mean faster results. For example, backsplash tiles can not be installed before a wall exists.

The cheapest quote is the best option

Not necessarily. Low bids can be misleading, often excluding important items. These omissions are sometimes intentional, making the bid appear more attractive, while knowing that additional costs will arise during the project's execution and change orders will be numerous.

Remodeling costs more than expected

This is can be true. Remodeling projects can lead to unforeseen costs, usually related to the issues discovered once demolition starts. This is expected, as bidders cannot know what's behind your home's walls when preparing their quote. This is why homeowners must always set aside a proper contingency fund to support this additional cost.

Remodeling is always more expensive than buying

This depends. A cost analysis is necessary to assess the property's current value, the remodeling costs, and the projected post remodel market value.

A fixed price contract guarantees no extra costs

Wrong. A fixed price is always tied to a list of assumptions, conditions, and limitations. If a firm offers a fixed fee without these limitations, homeowners should assume the vendor has include a large contingency into the bid. This is rare, as firms using this approach typically price their quotes at least 20 to 25% higher than others.
